On this 28th day of May A.D.

1857 personally appeared before me a justice of the peace within and for the County and State aforesaid Ann S Flood aged 67 years a resident of Buckingham County in the State of Virginia who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Daniel Flood deceased, who was a private in the Company Commanded by Captain Anthony Woodson in the Regiment of Virginia Militia Commanded by Colonel Lindsay ^{as shown in the records} in the War with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18th day of June 1812 that her said husband enlisted at Buckingham County Virginia on or about the 15th day of April 1812 for the term of ~~six~~ ^{three} months and continued in actual service in said War for the term of ~~six~~ ^{nine} months and was honorably discharged at Norfolk on the day of August 1812.


She further states that she was married to the said Daniel Flood in the County of Buckingham on the 20th day of June 1812 by one Noah Flood a publick Clergyman and that her name before her said Marriage was Ann S Coleman; that her said husband died at home in the County of Buckingham State of Virginia on the 10th day of October 1850 and that she is now a widow.

She further declares that she has heretofore made application for bounty land under the act approved September 28 1850 and obtained a land warrant for ~~eighty~~ ^{four} acres which she has legally disposed of, and it cannot now be returned. She makes

this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty
land to which she may be entitled under the act
approved March 3 1855.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which she may be entitled under the "Act granting bounty land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," passed Sept. 28, 1850.

DECLARATION OF A WIDOW FOR PENSION.

State of Virginia

On this 10th day of April, A. D. eighteen hundred and seventy-one
personally appeared before me, John Rice, Judge, of the County Court
of Buckingham, a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid,

Ann S. Flood, aged Eighty years, a resident of
Buckingham County of Buckingham, State
of Virginia, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is

the widow of Daniel Flood, who served the full period of sixty
days in the (1) Military service of the United States in the War of 1812, and who was the identical

Daniel Flood who (2) was Enlisted in Captain
Anthony Woodsons Company, Prince Edward Co Va
Regiment, Brigade, Division, at

..... on the April day of
1814, and was honorably discharged at Norfolk City on the

day of August, 1814; that (3) her husband Daniel Flood
received bounty land, the number of the acres not
now remembered

that she was married under the name of Ann S. Coleman to said
Daniel Flood, on the 18th day of

June, A. D. 1812, by Noah Flood, at
her Fathers Residence, there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that her

said husband died at his Residence, on the 10th
day of October, 1850, and that she has not remarried since his death; that

at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States did she or her said husband adhere
to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office
whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; that she will support the
Constitution of the United States; that she is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that she makes
this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension rolls of the United States, under the provisions of the
act approved February 14, 1871, and hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revoca-

tion, James L. Anderson of Buckingham Co. Va. Virginia
her true and lawful attorney, to prosecute her claim, and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that
